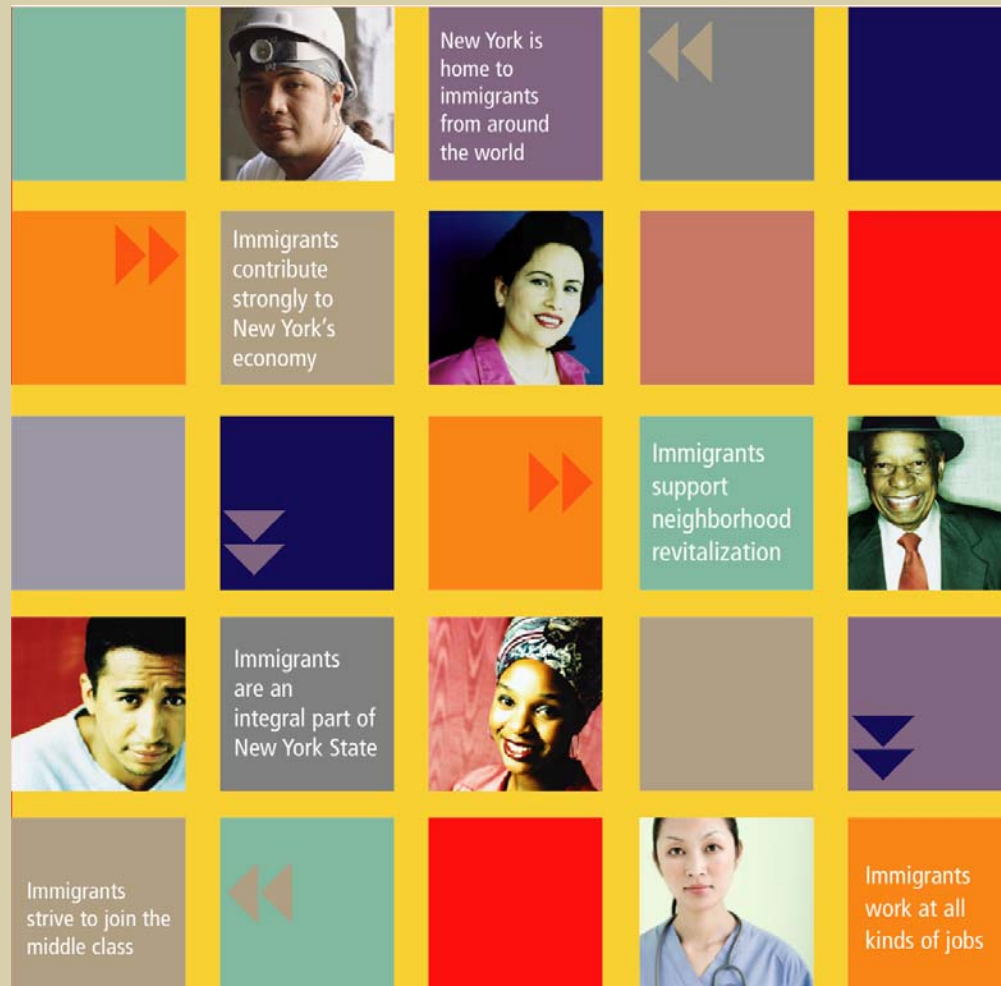

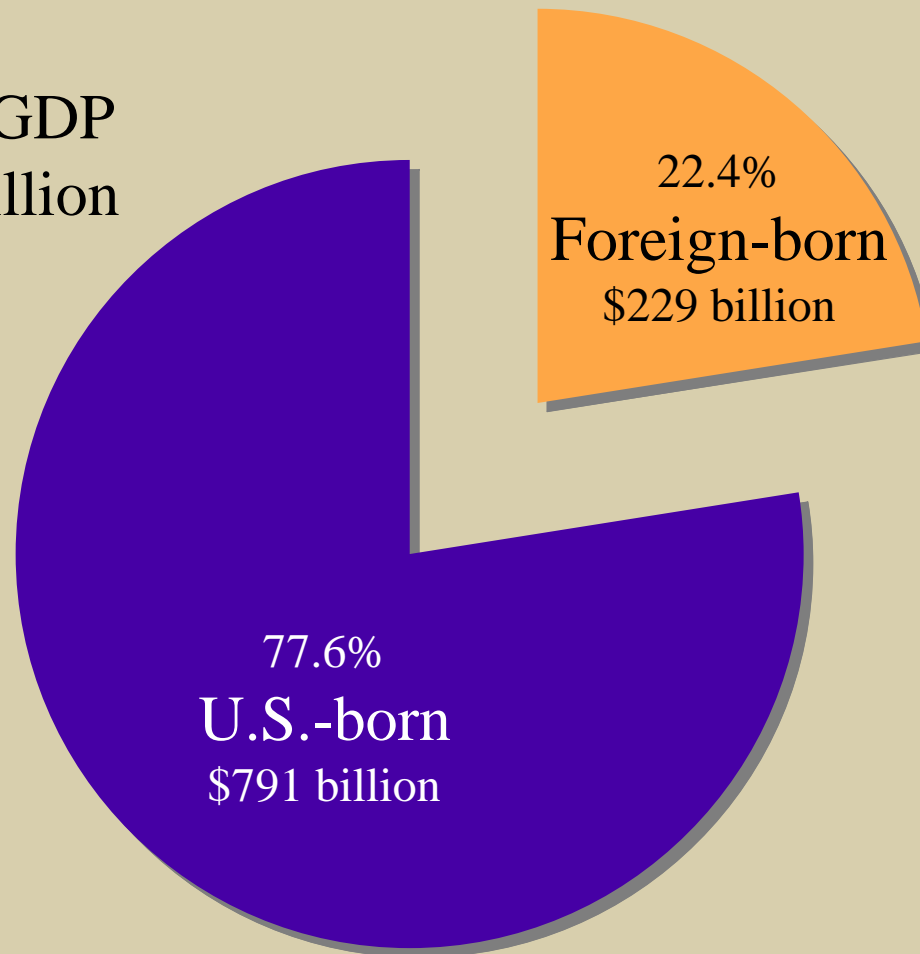
A Profile of Immigrants in the New York State Economy

In an overheated atmosphere, Fiscal Policy Institute set out to take a calm look at the *real role of immigrants* in New York



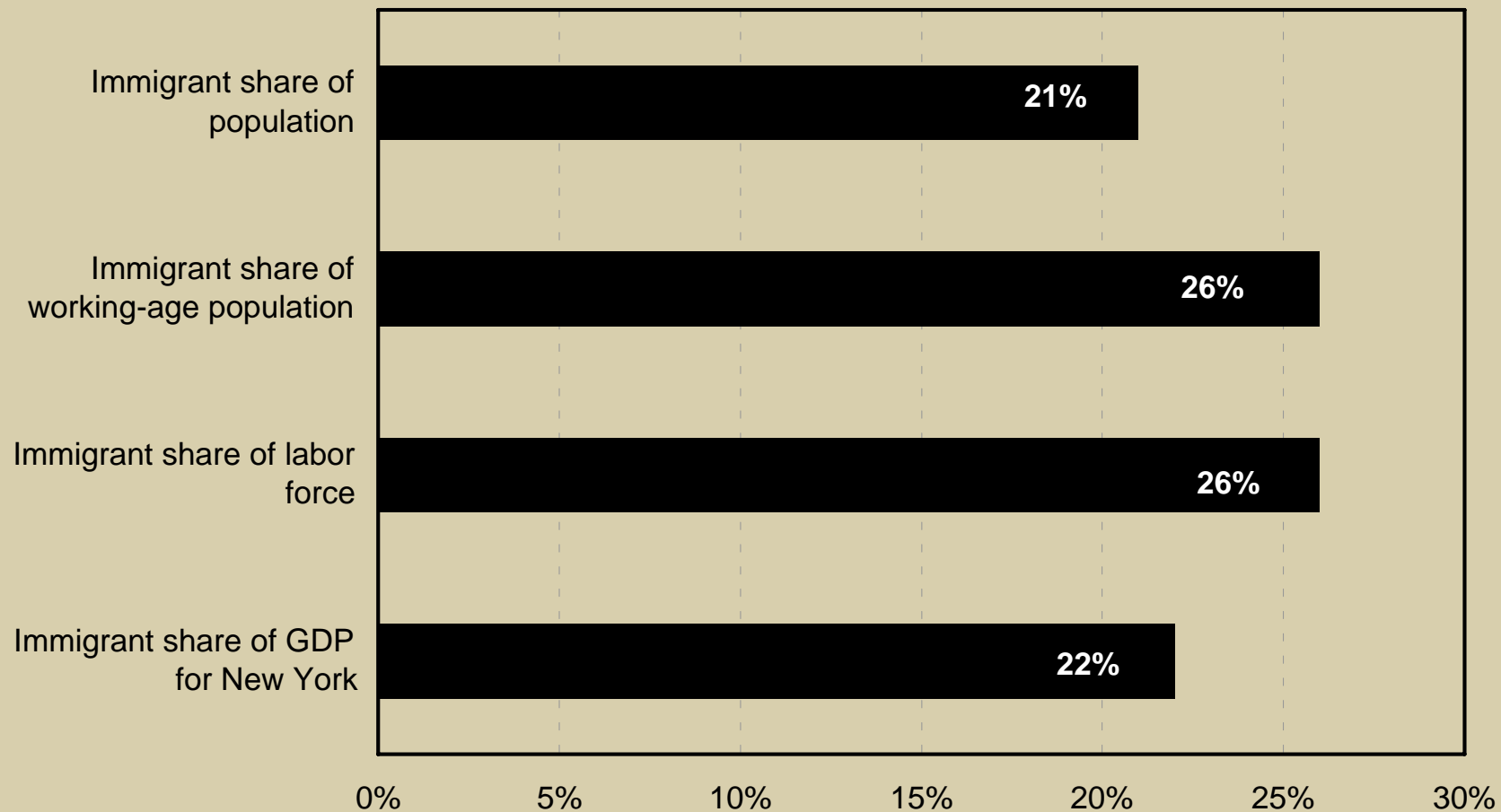
Immigrant **economic** contribution represents nearly

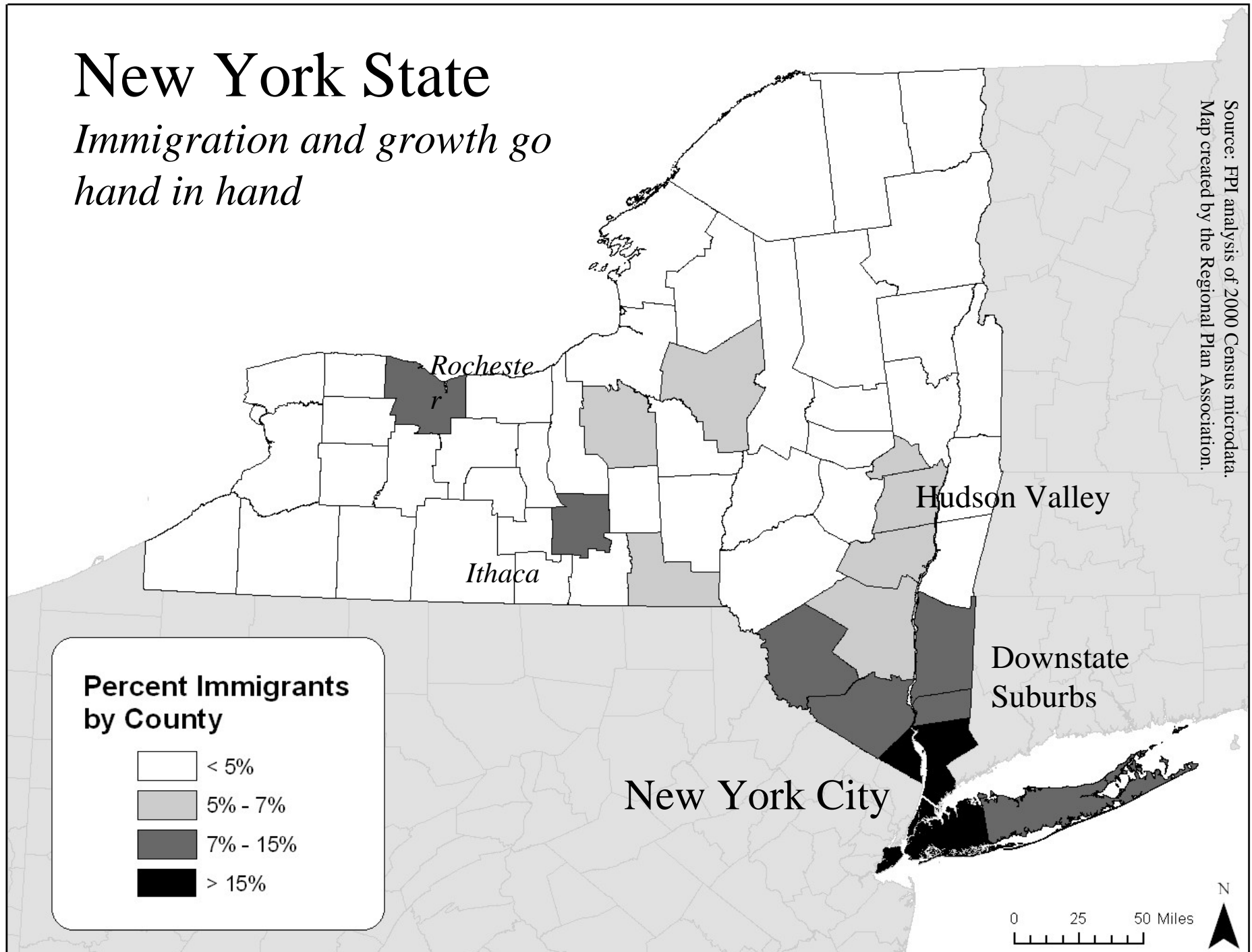
Immigrant **economic** contribution is the same as immigrants share of state population



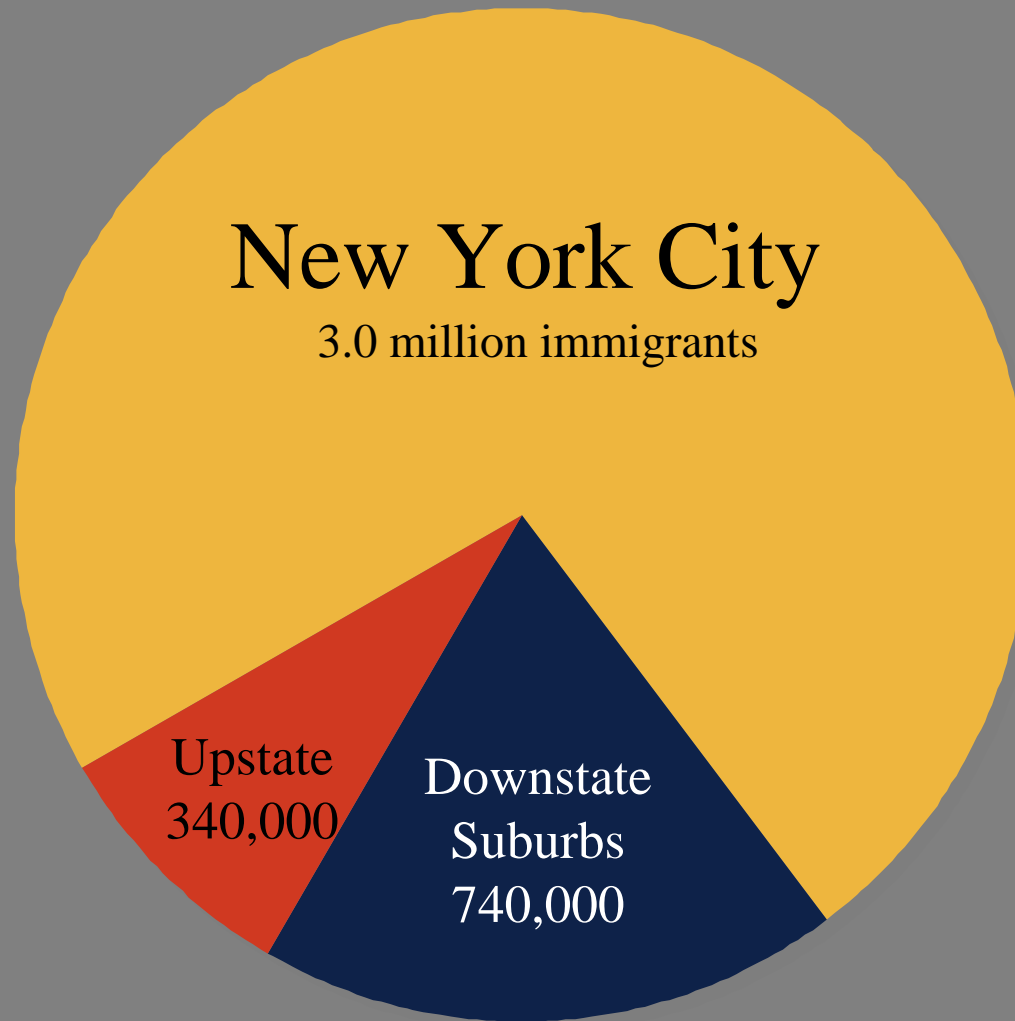

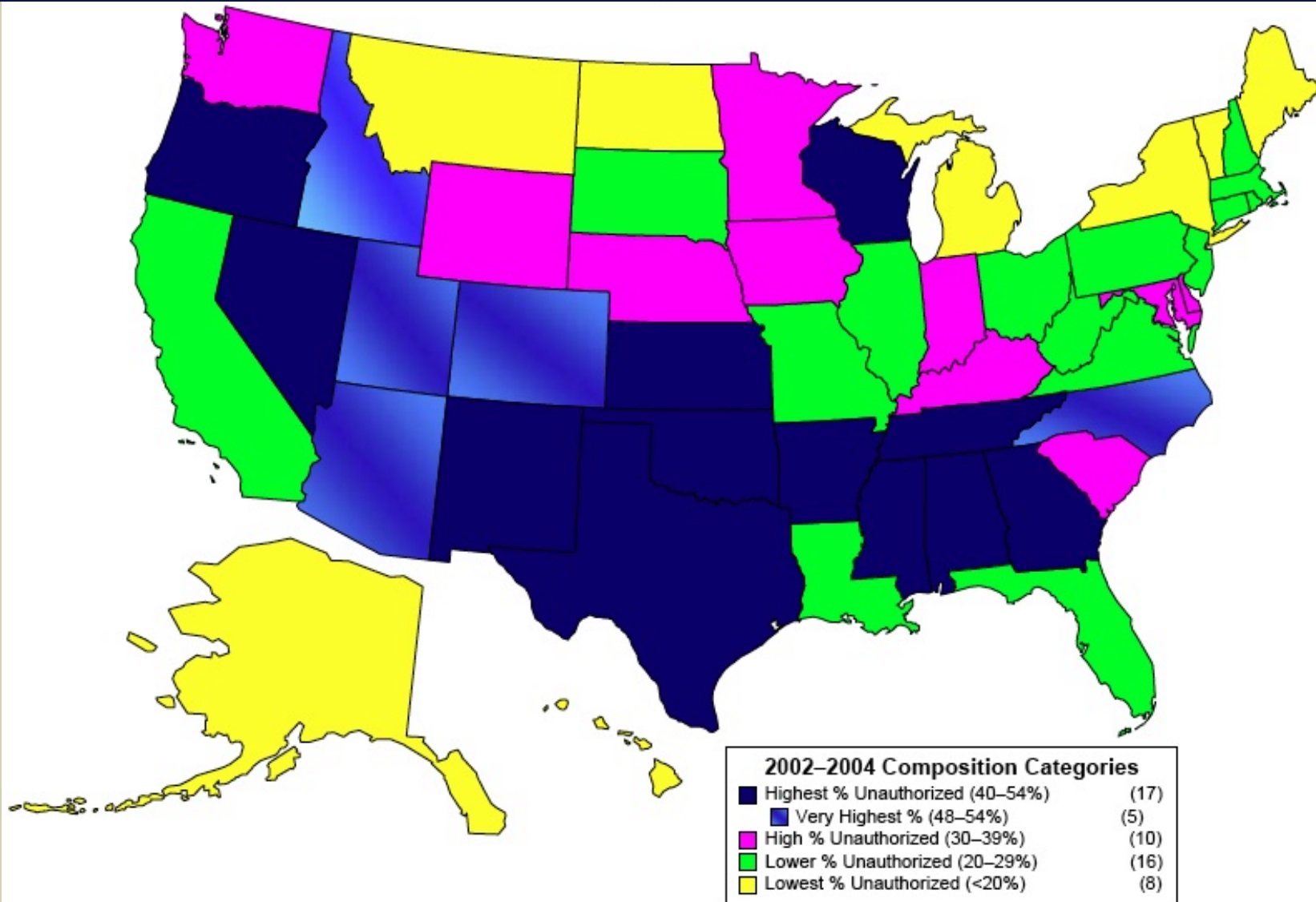

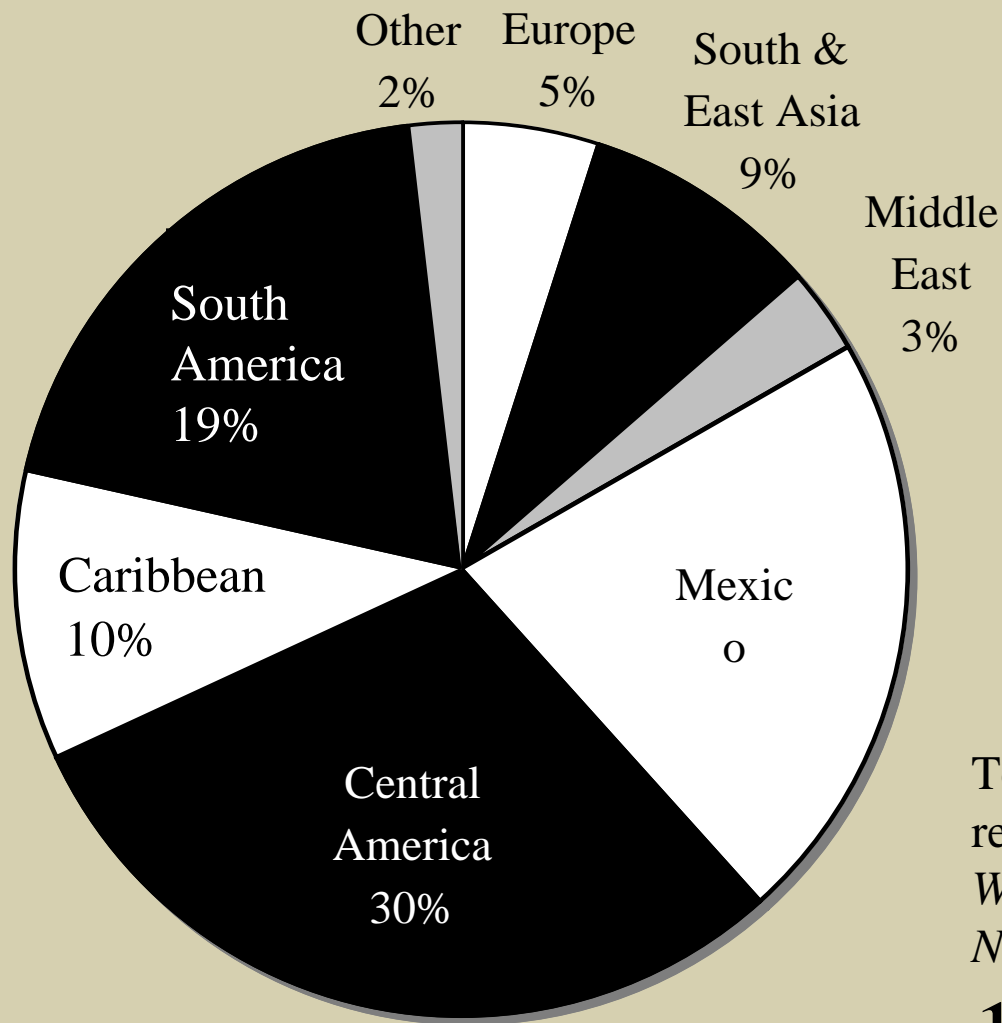

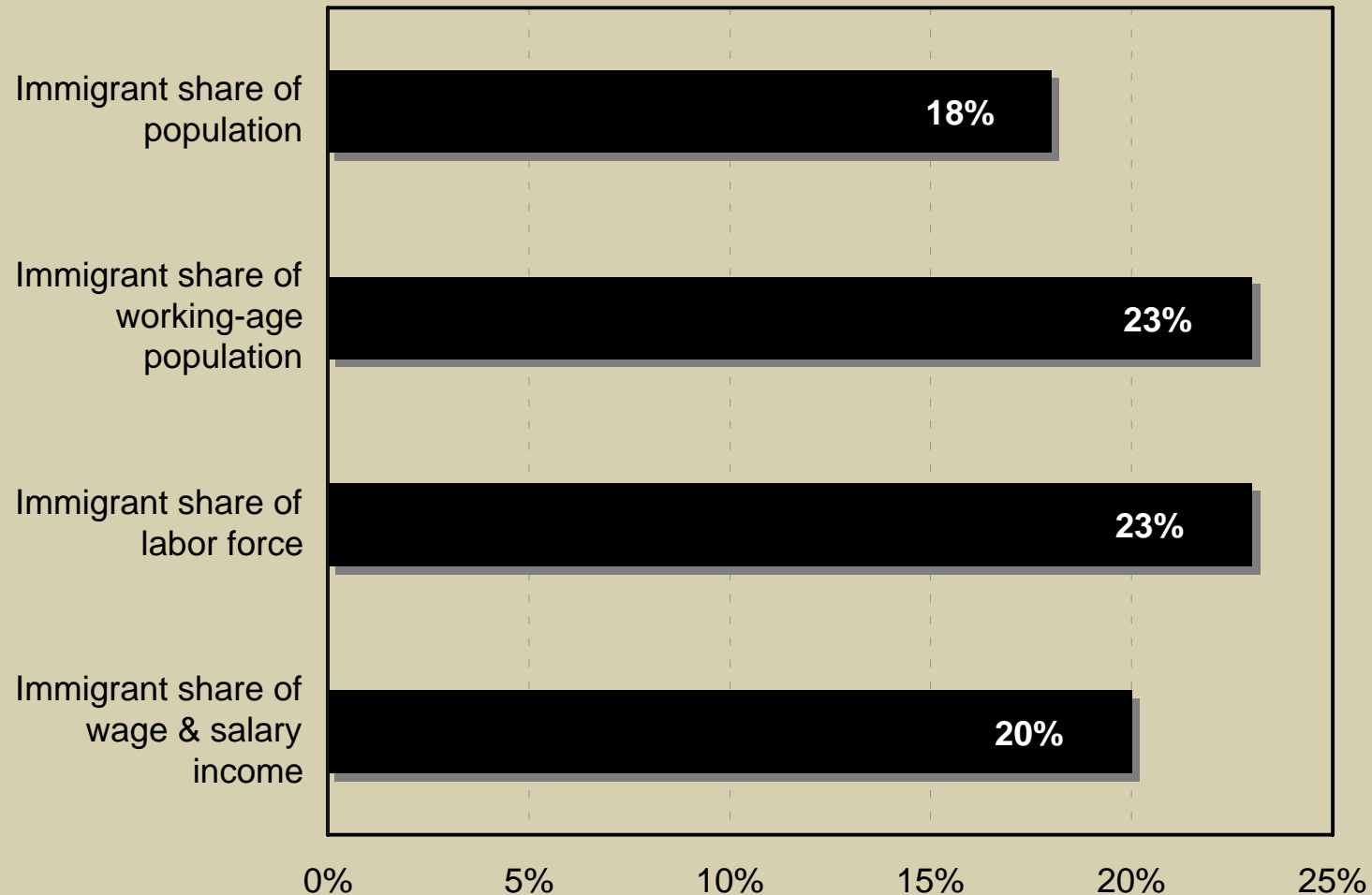
Even undocumented immigration is more diverse than you may think

Day laborers attract a lot of attention, but day laborers are
less than a half of one
percent of immigrants, and a small portion even
of undocumented immigrants in the area.

Based on Valenzuela & Meléndez estimate of 6,000-8,000 day laborers hired through shape-up sites in the entire New York metropolitan area, including New York City and suburbs in New York and New Jersey. See *Working for a Better Life* for further details.

A good number of construction workers, maids, and grounds maintenance workers are immigrants.

But in Westchester...

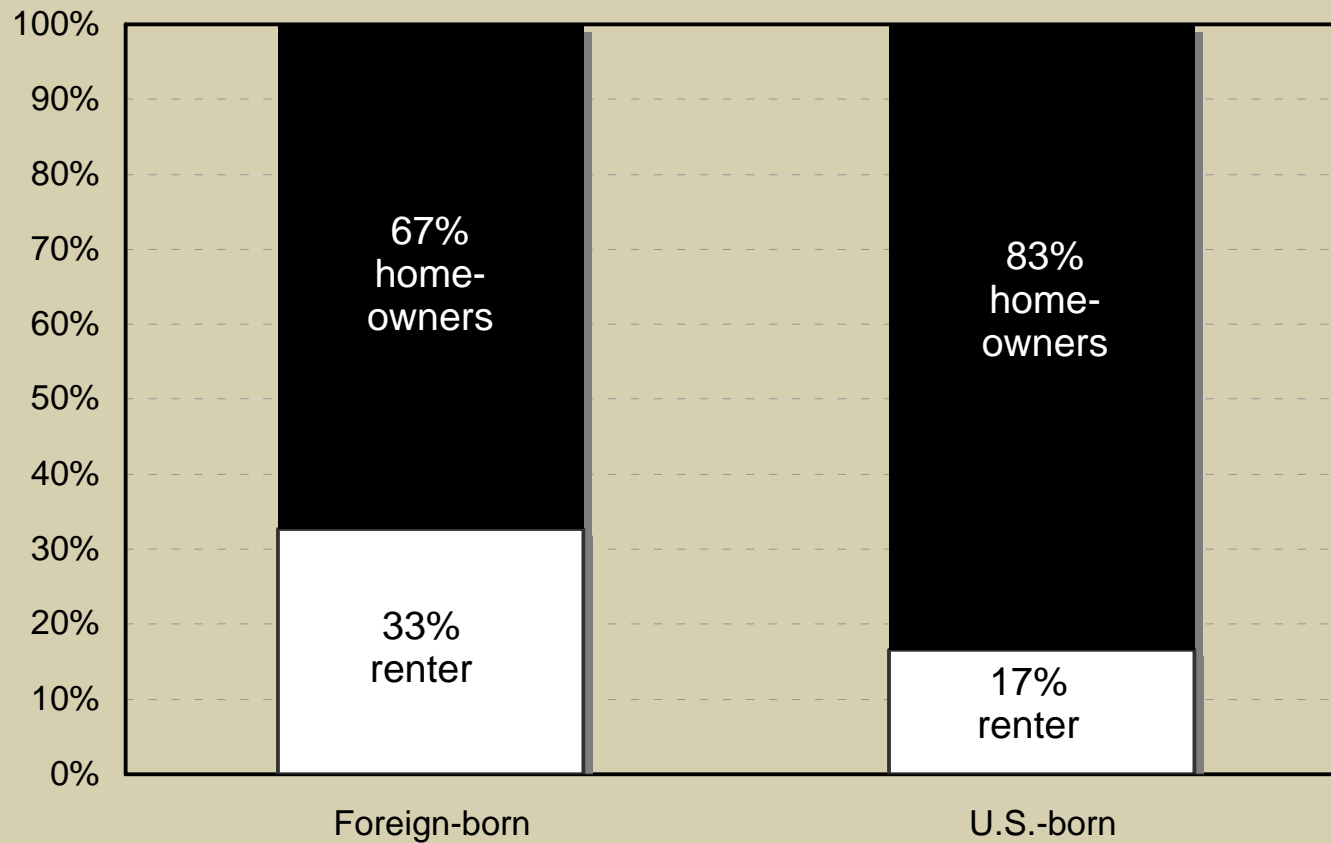
office and administrative support is the most occupational group with the largest number of immigrants (16,000) making up 20 percent of all workers in the group

30% of architects and engineers are foreign-born

41% of people working in health care support

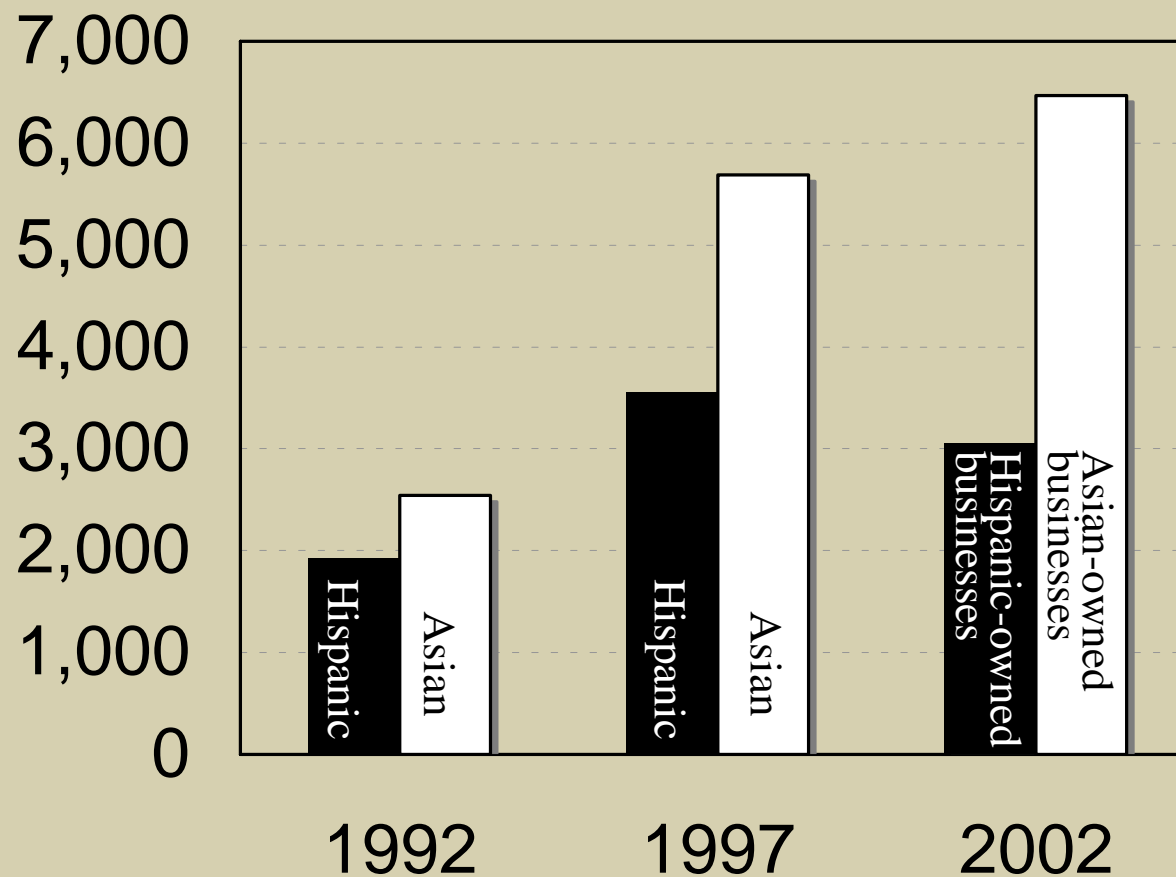
23% of sales workers

Immigrants *own homes*



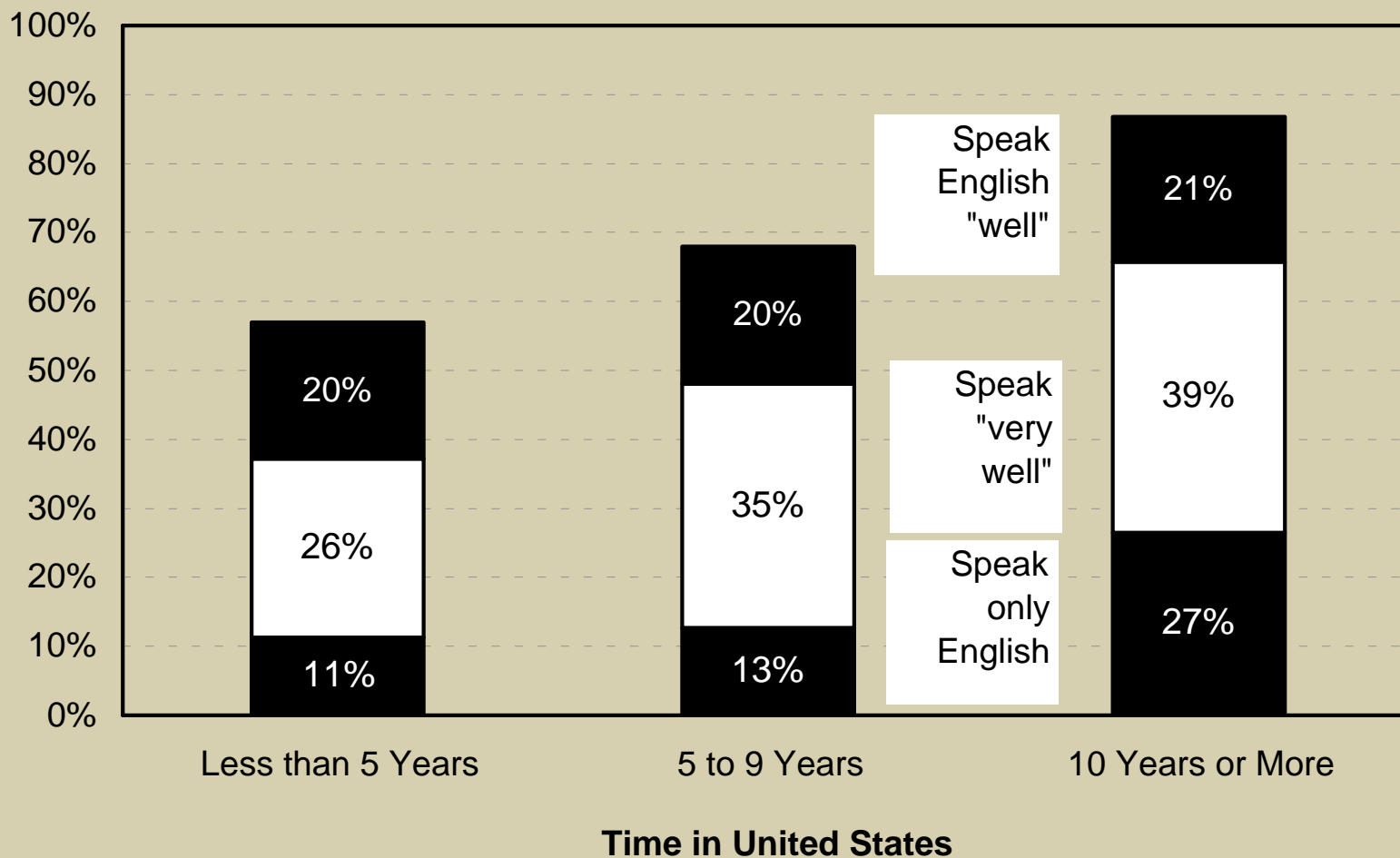
